Colin Brine and Benjamin Fields the started the meeting by having everyone introduce themselves. The Advisors at today's meeting included representatives from diverse populations, including the medical community, agricultural, faith organizations, senior population, students, the Latino population, education field and many others. They divided the room into working tables and included a good mix of the attendees at each table. They asked everyone to write on their name tents what the word "Leadership" means to them, each table shared their responses with the room.

The purpose of this kickoff meeting was to bring together Wenatchee community leaders and Wenatchee School District leaders to began a conversation about reaching out and involving the community with education and learning. Superintendent Brian Flones, has taken 5 months in the process of creating a vision with an innovative approach to face the huge changes that are taking place in society and the need to prepare our students for these changes. Mr. Flones made specific points:

- It is time to do something different
- We need to provide skills for our student's future Shift Age, a new era emerging as the Information Age
- Our students live in the digital revolution, they need 21 century skills
- Our students are digital learners
- They access information faster
- It's what they can do with the information that's going to make them successful
- We need the community to help make these changes happen, our schools cannot
- We have flat lined, some areas doing well others not so well
- We have come here today to hear from our leaders

Mr. Flones shared a video that outlined what trends are happening to our society/culture over the last 20 years, it illustrated the direction the world is going in reference to our working and learning environments. The attendees were amazed to see the statistics that they were shown and the fast changes that are taking place.

Beclearly Consultants, Colin Brine and Ben Field, facilitated several activities by asking each person to write down a learning experience they have been a part of in reaching out to the community experiences. Each table picked out one experience and shared it with the whole group. They also had each person fill out a card with answers to each of these questions.

- 1. What made you feel drawn to a career I the education field?
- 2. What have you learned about the importance of learning that people who aren't in your role might not know?
- 3. What difference does it make when people like you pursue a career in education?

They then shared their answers with each table.

Consultants Ben and Colin encouraged everyone to become engaged. They highlighted the following: *What you need to know:*

- 1. Wenatchee Learns is about creating a Whole Learning Community.
- 2. We will forge relationships with our community to promote two-way communication and support.
- 3. Our community will help us architect an extraordinary future for local learning.

Mr. Brine presented the following handout and pointed out the vision & all four of their steps individually as follows:




Mr. Brine explained the concept of networking within our areas of influence. He used the graph to illustrate the components of each level:


- o Leaders

Mr. Brine explained the idea of an iStory.


- Your experience

- o Pride in your story and your community




He also illustrated the flow of communication and shared information between groups, which included the qualities of an advisor in relationship with others.
