I have all year classes and I schedule normal lessons/assessments for those days regardless of type of finals schedule. I do think there's a discrepancy about "finals" regarding the expectations. Some staff incorrectly assume that finals are given all day. Other staff understand the A/B all year course planning and other staff give their final assessment prior to the "final" day, utilizing their "final" day to go over the final, meet with students to discuss their final grade and go over any last minute issues.

The one item I would argue against...having a final, then having students have to come back to that class later. There seems to be agreement that this isn't serving students and staff well.
