2015 NCW College & Career Expo

The College & Career Expo returns to Wenatchee Valley College on Tuesday, Nov. 3, from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Wenatchee High School students will be attending the event grouped by grade level starting with the freshman class. Travel will be by school bus.

Students will have the opportunity to visit with area businesses, vocational training organizations, military representatives, colleges and universities. There will be interactive displays with college and career information.

New this year will be four 20-minute evening information sessions with nine universities. Connect with representatives from the schools; explore financial aid options, admissions requirements and program offerings. These sessions are at WVC from 6-8 p.m. and are open to all area high school and transfer students and their families.

Safety and Security

In an effort to improve safety at WHS, we will be implementing several new policies effective Monday, October 26th.

➤ The Main Entrance doors will be open at 6:30 a.m. daily. (School offices are open from 7:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.)

The Athletic entrance inner doors will remain locked at all times prior to and throughout the school day and will not be accessible as a building entrance by students or others without a key. These doors will be opened at the end of the school day for athletes and others exiting the building.

➤ The Athletic entrance outer doors will be open at 7:30 a.m. daily. (The Athletic office is open from 7:30 – 4:30 p.m.)

The parking areas in the back of the building will be assigned as staff parking only. The back parking area is not an area for student drop off or pick up.

> The front parking lot will be for student and visitor parking only.
