FAFSA/WAFSA Information

If you will have a student attending postsecondary (2-year college, 4-year college, technical/professional school) education during the 2017-2018 school year and are in need of financial aid, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA) open on October 1. Even if you don't think you qualify, the FAFSA/WASFA need to be completed.

The College Mentor Program (CMP) welcomes you to come to the CMP Tuesday Nights through October (6-8pm, WHS Library) to complete your FAFSA/WASFA and have access to in-person financial aid experts. Use the attached FAFSA Checklist to make sure you have all the right documents to take advantage of this night of help.
