Math Options at Wenatchee High School

Students must complete 3 credits of math to graduate. Required math classes are Algebra I and Geometry. The third math credit can be met by passing one of the following classes:

- Applied Math
- Bridge to Algebra II
- Algebra II
- Accounting
- Computer Science

Other math courses offered after completion of Algebra II are: (in sequential order)

- Trigonometry
- Pre-Calculus I
- Pre-Calculus II
- Calculus AB
- Calculus BC
- Calculus III
- Advanced Placement Statistics (can be taken after passing Algebra II)

Also available to students who have completed Algebra II is a <u>Bridge to College Math</u> course. This class is offered to students who plan on attending college, but who struggled to pass Algebra II.

Bridge to College Mathematics is a fourth-year (senior-level) course designed to follow Algebra II and develop college readiness in students. Students who earn a "B" or better in the Bridge Course are eligible to enter college-level mathematics coursework in any of the State of Washington Community and Technical Colleges. Bridge to College Math is also a designated transition course that fulfills a Graduation Pathway.
