#### **Online Tutoring and Homework Help:**

Wenatchee High School has partnered with an online tutoring service to provide students with another opportunity for 1-on-1 homework help. This service allows students to work with a tutor at any time during the day or night (24/7). The service provides support for over 40 subject areas including all AP courses, and you will find that Spanish speaking tutors are available in math, science and social studies.

When students login to the service, the amount of time they work with a tutor is deducted from the total hours that we have purchased. The time deducted is the same regardless of the subject area students choose, or the time of day students are accessing the service. So, we ask that the time is used wisely.

The service may be used on a computer, tablet or smartphone and all correspondence is recorded within their system for the purpose of student safety.




High school students have four options for jump-starting their college careers:

## WHS Career Center Update

#### \* \* REMIND Announcement Reminder \* \*



We received an email from Remind (the app that is used to communicate with students over text) letting us know that as of **January 28**, students who have service through **Verizon Wireless** will no longer be able to receive Remind text messages. Since this is currently a primary way for the high school to communicate with students, if you have Verizon Wireless service, download the Remind app *OR* enable email notifications in order to receive messages.



Students who took the **PSAT** are encouraged to take the next step on their **SAT** practice journey by linking their College Board and a Khan Academy® account, which unlocks a *free* SAT study plan. Linking their accounts will send their PSAT/NMSQT® scores to Khan Academy, giving them access to a personalized experience on **Official SAT Practice**. Research shows that studying on Official SAT Practice for a total of 20 hours is associated with an average score gain of 115 points from the PSAT/NMSQT to the SAT. If your student is more interested in learning a trade and joining the workforce than attending college, check into **Job Corps**. Job Corps is a no-cost education and career technical training program administered by the U.S. Department of Labor that helps young people ages 16 to 24 improve the quality of their lives through career technical and academic training. Students can earn a high school diploma or the equivalent, or college credits through Job Corps. They offer career technical training in more than 100 career areas. Students receive housing/dormitories, nutritious meal options, basic medical care, a living allowance, and career training **all at no cost**. After graduation, a career transition specialist will help your student make the transition from Job Corps into the real world. Visit **recruiting.jobcorps.gov** for more information.
