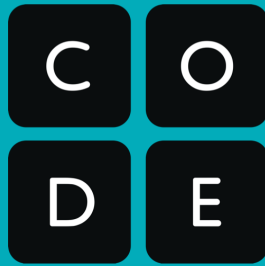

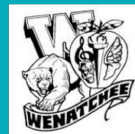
Thursday December 6th

Online Tutoring and Homework Help:

Wenatchee High School has partnered with an online tutoring service to provide students with another opportunity for 1-on-1 homework help. This service allows students to work with a tutor at any time during the day or night (24/7). The service provides support for over 40 subject areas including all AP courses, and you will find that Spanish speaking tutors are available in math, science and social studies.

When students login to the service, the amount of time they work with a tutor is deducted from the total hours that we have purchased. The time deducted is the same regardless of the subject area students choose, or the time of day students are accessing the service. So, we ask that the time is used wisely.

The service may be used on a computer, tablet or smartphone and all correspondence is recorded within their system for the purpose of student safety.

Messages from the WHS Career Center



Students needing help with their college search should check out the Department of Education's **College Scorecard**. Searches can be filtered by program of study/major, location, size, public/private, special interest, or religion. Website: <https://collegescorecard.ed.gov/>



Students interested in attending an out-of-state 2 or 4 year public college should check to see if the school participates in the **WUE (Western Undergraduate Exchange) Program**. Through WUE, students in Western states may enroll at participating schools at a reduced tuition level from normal out-of-state costs. Check with the school's financial aid office to find out the process for applying.



Scholarship information is beginning to arrive, so students should be prepared to spend quality time on their applications. Needed for most applications are the student's EFC (estimated family contribution based on FAFSA results), a personal statement/essay, and 3 or 4 letters of recommendation from teachers, counselors, coaches, or employers.
