# WHS REGISTRATION PROCESS

Registration for the 2018/19 school year takes place this spring. All registration will be conducted through the student's Skyward account. Essentially, this is a two- step process. **If you have any questions, feel free to contact your student's counselor.**

## Step 1

**In February and March, students communicate their class requests in writing.** Counselors confirm that students request courses required for graduation. Students **are not** limited to only these classes when they build their schedules in Step 2. WHS uses this information to determine student need and build the master schedule.

## Step 2

**In late April or May, students log into Skyward through their student account to build their schedule for the following year.** Students must know their student Skyward login ID and password to register. This information may be obtained through the counseling office. Each graduating class, starting with current juniors, will have several days in which to build their schedules.

*If students need assistance, counselors are available in the Career Center and library each day to assist in the process. Counselors check each schedule after the scheduling window closes to make sure it is complete and appropriate.*

**A video demonstrating the scheduling process will be available on the WHS website and is shown in classes.**

**Students who choose not to create a schedule will have a one created for them.**

## **Online Tutoring and Homework Help:**

Wenatchee High School has partnered with an online tutoring service to provide students with another opportunity for 1-on-1 homework help. This service allows students to work with a tutor at any time during the day or night (24/7). The service provides support for over 40 subject areas including all AP courses, and you will find that Spanish speaking tutors are available in math, science and social studies.

When students login to the service, the amount of time they work with a tutor is deducted from the total hours that we have purchased. The time deducted is the same regardless of the subject area students choose, or the time of day students are accessing the service. So, we ask that the time is used wisely.

The service may be used on a computer, tablet or smartphone and all correspondence is recorded within their system for the purpose of student safety.

**The Cougs Rise Program** is an initiative of the WSU Office of the Provost funded by grants from the U.S. Department of Education. ## STARS Engineering Scholars

The Washington State Academic RedShirt (STARS) program supports engineering and computer science students from low-income, first-generation, and underserved backgrounds in navigating the transition to college-level engineering courses.

STARS is a two-year program with a specialized curriculum designed to build learning skills and strengthen academic preparation for core math and science prerequisites. STARS scholars are guaranteed placement into an engineering or computer science major.

### STARS scholars...

- Are a tight-knit engineering learning community
- Master core problem-solving skills in math, chemistry, physics, and computer science
- Do better in fundamental math and science courses
- Improve their studying, test-taking, and time-management skills
- Receive personalized academic and career counseling
- Benefit from peer and faculty mentoring
- Learn about internship and research opportunities
- May be eligible for scholarships when funding is available
- Cultivate **passion**, **perseverance**, and **grit** inside and outside the classroom

### Eligibility requirements

- Admitted incoming freshman at the University of Washington, Seattle campus (*STARS is not offered at UW Bothell or UW Tacoma*)
- Washington State resident and graduate of a Washington high school
- Eligible for financial aid (preference for Husky Promise, Pell Grant, and State Need Grant recipients)
- Engineering or computer science indicated as first-choice major on the UW application
