## Scholarship Reminders From the Career Center

- If your student will be attending a Washington State college or University and is thinking of a career in a STEM (science, technology, engineering, or math) or Health Care field please remind them to apply for the **Washington State Opportunity Scholarship**. This scholarship is for low-to-middle income families. Required GPA is 2.75. The application and eligibility information is online at [www.waopportunitiescholarship.org](http://www.waopportunitiescholarship.org). The deadline for applying is Wednesday, Feb. 28.
- The **Community Foundation of North Central Washington** is accepting applications for more than 100 scholarships. Have your student log in to [www.cfncw.org](http://www.cfncw.org), click the “Apply for Scholarships” button then the green “Apply Now” button. The student will be directed to an eligibility quiz that will provide a list of the Community Foundation scholarships he or she is eligible to apply for. The deadline for applying to the majority of these scholarships is March 1.
- If your family is linked to the Tree Fruit Industry through employment, your student may be eligible for scholarships through the **Washington Apple Education Foundation**. There is a single application and the student is matched to eligible scholarships. Apply online at [www.waef.org](http://www.waef.org) before the deadline of March 1.
- For parents of **Sophomores**, if your student needs extra support to be successful through the remainder of their high school years, there is the **Wenatchee Sunrise Rotary Challenge Scholarship**. The purpose of the scholarship fund and program is to challenge the student to (1) finish high school, (2) demonstrate service to the community through volunteering, and (3) to enroll in post high school education. Students who are awarded this scholarship will have a mentor to help them during their junior and senior years, and upon graduation and application to college, receive a financial award towards tuition. Applications are in the Career Center and the deadline to apply is April 6.

## **Online Tutoring and Homework Help:**

Wenatchee High School has partnered with an online tutoring service to provide students with another opportunity for 1-on-1 homework help. This service allows students to work with a tutor at any time during the day or night (24/7). The service provides support for over 40 subject areas including all AP courses, and you will find that Spanish speaking tutors are available in math, science and social studies.

When students login to the service, the amount of time they work with a tutor is deducted from the total hours that we have purchased. The time deducted is the same regardless of the subject area students choose, or the time of day students are accessing the service. So, we ask that the time is used wisely.

The service may be used on a computer, tablet or smartphone and all correspondence is recorded within their system for the purpose of student safety.
