Loss of grandmother inspires athlete to pursue a nursing career

She started her day thinking nothing could stop her; she was sure that she could get through that last day of finals, but she didn't take into consideration that school wasn't her top priority... family was, and still is. During one of her most crucial finals, Wenatchee High School senior Amber Jellison got a call that would ruin her day, but shape her entire path to success.

After learning her grandmother had suffered from a stroke, Jellison gladly left her test incomplete to go comfort and support one of her best friends, in turn failing the class. She showed up to the hospital learning that her grandmother was going to be okay, but the stroke would lead to complications.

Only the inspired and motivated can turn traumas into nirvanas. Although the incident dampened her day and still makes everyday life harder for her, Jellison used her love and care for her grandmother to now pursue a goal she

had never previously thought about: becoming a nurse.

"Definitely one of the worst days of my life, but it really inspired me to help people just like her, now knowing how awful something like that can be," Jellison said.

She plans on attending Wenatchee Valley College to study nursing next fall. Jellison hadn't exactly had an easy life even before that life-changing event. Jellison had to go two and a half years without another one of her best friends, at the worst time: moving to a new school.

"Definitely one of the hardest times of my life," said Jellison.

Although ultimately surviving the time, she suffered sports-related knee injuries that would disable her from playing two of the sports she loves, basketball and volleyball. Yet still, her spirits weren't flattened. She settled with playing her third sport, softball, even more often.

She is now on the WHS varsity softball team, and her teammates and coaches have nothing but great things to say about her.

"Great player; great leader; great kid. She's everything you want in a player," coach and leadership teacher Brent Grothe said.

"She cares about the team more than anyone I know. I'm glad we have her with us," senior Carley Gangle said.

Her true characteristics were shown in those horrific and unfortunate hours. Her ability to keep playing the sport she loves even after terrifying injuries shows her passion, and her ability to still keep a smile on her face shows her strength. The ordinary 18 year old, after going through everything Jellison has, would end up broken, secluded, and emotionless, but she still appears to be an inspiration and light to other's lives.

"I'm gonna miss her, but she's going to go on to do amazing things," said Grothe

Just the knowledge that we were going to be together was amazing," Cassiano said.

For her future, Cassiano looks forward to going on a year and a half long mission trip after finishing her studies at Wenatchee Valley College. After her return, Cassiano hopes to attend a four year university and pursue a career as a veterinarian, possibly becoming an aviary specialist. And always, Cassiano moves forward with the knowledge that behind her is the love and support of her family for all eternity.
