- 2. Tech suggestions We don't have time to train each other and do PLC work. Maybe we could have ½ day off (kids could be doing Asynchronous learning) where we can get some tech training in. *The* 9<sup>th</sup> of October could be a day where we put in some tech training. We were going to do Character Strong, but we can see if we can move it. You can call in for audio tech support until **7pm**, so that is something can be used by individual staff as well. Not everyone knows this apparently. Canvas mentors have been fantastic and very accessible.
- 3. Maybe we can keep a document tracking what help people have asked for and received so it can be accessed by staff seeking help whose concerns might already have been addressed.
- 4. Teachers are exhausted and this is all taking longer to do. Can we sustain this schedule for long? Would like to see more time for asynchronous learning where PLCs could meet and get things done. I don't see us getting a lot of traction around days in PLCs, but we need to communicate to teachers that we don't need to be driving content for the entire 70 minutes of class. Teachers can do a lot of things with that time, breakout rooms etc. We encourage teachers to think about how they are using the time they have in class in order to accommodate the other things they need to do. Schedule-wise, we have 4.5 hours a day of teachers in front of kids and 3 hours a day of teachers not in front of kids (I might have heard it wrong tho).
