



Expectations for bringing students back onto Campus:

We will limit the total number of students in the school to 80 students at each school site. Each class will be held in well ventilated spaces, with a 10:1 ratio, and implement all mitigating strategies:

- **Monogamous cohorting -**
 - *students will not engage with other students from any other programs.*
 - *Also students will stay in assigned groups and will not be able to rotate with others within the same program. Once groups are set, they are set.*
 - *I will need each instructor to create a schedule and set-up student groups.*
 - *Students do not have to participate in the on campus activities.*

- **6-feet social distancing-**
 - *Maintain 6 feet of distance from other students/staff.*
 - *If a staff member needs to help a student they can be less than 6ft, but only for less than 15 minutes.*

- **Masks required by staff and students-**
 - *This is at all times. Nose and mouth covered. No gators, no shields.*

- *If PT is done outside then masks can be removed, but students have got to be 6ft away.*
- *DMA- When interviewing a person, the person being interviewed can remove the mask if outside. Again everyone needs social distance.*

- ***Proper Hygiene-***
 - *Students must wash hands when entering the building.*
 - *At every scheduled break hands need to be washed.*
 - *Sneeze into elbow area.*
 - *Keep hands and fingers away from the face.*

- ***Restrooms use will be assigned and access to the building restricted only to those areas needed for participation.-***
 - *Building C/Automotive Tech does not have to worry about a schedule. Program is in it's own building with its own restrooms.*
 - *Building A & B, a schedule will be created for when students can take a break and use the bathroom.*
 - *Bathroom use will be one at a time and students need to wash hands before and after use.*
 - *After each program's break, the bathroom and door handles need to be sprayed down with Virex by office staff. No one will be able to use bathrooms until after 15 minutes from the time of spray down.*
 - *Restrooms will be the only Common Space that students will have access to and this will be scheduled.*
 - *Drinking fountains are not to be used except to fill water bottles. This can only happen during scheduled breaks. Students should bring a full bottle to school.*

- **Daily attestation by students and staff-**
 - *All students will enter through the program's outside entrance, not through the main doors and hallways.*
 - *Students and staff must use either the online health survey or paper version daily before entering the building.*
 - *Also students need to wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer upon entry to the program space. This means instructors you need to be at your door making sure these things happen.*
 - *If a student is not looking good, take their temperature. If they have a temperature they need to go home. If the student says they are feeling ill please call the office and someone will come get the student. A district document is filled out, and the student is put into an isolation room awaiting to be sent home.*

Additional Items:

- Every room will need a table that is easily accessible with hand sanitizer and additional masks.
 - Note that while hand sanitizer is very helpful, guide students to use hot water and soap as much as possible.
 - Tables as well as any equipment used will need to be cleaned with Virex between AM and PM class.
 - If students need to use the same equipment during the same session they must wear gloves and/or items need to be cleaned off after each person uses them.
 - Please only use soap and water when students are in the class.
 - Teaching materials are not to be shared.
 - **Most recent explanation of what happens if someone may have or been around someone COVID-19**
1. Students and Staff will be screened for fever, symptoms*, and exposure** - daily. Screenings will occur at home and/or at school.

2. If symptoms are consistent with COVID, home for 10 days (DOH guidelines) - unless symptoms explained by other illness - or note from a health care provider (see #4 below).
 - a. Example: an individual has sore throat and fever. Seen by PCP (primary care provider) and found to have strep throat. Antibiotics prescribed, and student/staff person may return 24 hours after initiating treatment.
 - b. Example: an individual has non-productive cough and no fever, body aches, loss of smell, etc. Has a known history of asthma. This student would not necessarily be excluded from school.
3. If known close exposure to COVID - even without symptoms, home for 14 days (DOH guidelines). School should be notified.
 - a. Example: an individual has spent more than 10 minutes, without social distancing with + case, then follow DOH guidelines (quarantined for 14 days).
4. If symptoms occur/are noted at school, individuals will be separated from others. Masks will be worn and physical distancing (6 feet) will be maintained. Staff will immediately go home. Students will be kept in "sick room" and families will be notified that their student will need to be taken home right away. Room will need to be "aired out" and disinfected after students leaves.
5. Returning to school after testing positive for COVID-19.

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, the local health jurisdiction will advise, but it is likely that many of the student's classmates will be considered close contacts and need to be quarantined for 14 days. The student or staff member who had confirmed COVID-19 can return to the program when:

- At least 24 hours have passed since recovery - defined as no fever without the use of medications and improvement in respiratory signs like cough and shortness of breath;
AND
- At least 10 days have passed since signs first showed up.

6. Returning to school after being in close contact with someone with COVID-19.

If a person believes that they have had close contact with someone with COVID-19, but they are not sick, they should watch their health for signs of fever, cough, shortness of breath, and other COVID-19 symptoms during the 14 days after the last day they were in close contact with the person sick with COVID-19. They should not go to work, child care, school, or public places for 14 days. If a person develops symptoms of COVID-19 during their quarantine, they should seek testing for COVID-19, and follow guidance above for confirmed COVID-19 cases. Consider testing at day 10 even if no symptoms are present. However, a negative test after exposure does not shorten the 14 day quarantine period.

***Symptoms (On the first day after a break or for a new student, please ask about past 3 days (72 Hours):**

Fever (100.4 F) or chills

Cough

Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Unusual fatigue

Muscle or body aches

Headache

Recent loss of taste or smell

Sore throat

Congestion or runny nose

Nausea or vomiting

Diarrhea

****Exposure Questions:**

Have you been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?

Have you had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?

Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told you to self-monitor, self-isolate, or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19 infection.

If yes, refer to "Returning to school after suspected COVID-19 symptoms."
